What:

- *Intern position for undergraduate/graduate student in UNL Extension.
- *Twelve week salaried position.
- *Credit hours and course requirements to be determined jointly by academic department and Cooperative Extension. Academic credit will be issued by the department.
- *Available to students completing either sophomore or junior undergraduate year or to a graduate student if allowed by the department.

When: Summer sessions

Where: Located and supervised in a county University of Nebraska–Lincoln Extension office, location to be determined in the spring upon application of student and supervisor. Students may have the opportunity for a split appointment between a rural and urban setting.
