Meeting the Challenge

As many Nebraska rural communities face dwindling numbers of businesses, many youth are compelled to leave rural areas to find employment. However, entrepreneurship can empower youth to stay in rural Nebraska to create jobs for tomorrow's Nebraskans. Opportunities are available for:

- Youth from middle school through college work to with educators and community volunteers to learn how to become entrepreneurs.
- Communities to learn to be supportive of all local entrepreneurs.

4-H experiential entrepreneurship curricula are delivered in schools, after school programs, camps and in community-focused programs across the state. Engler Agribusiness Entrepreneurship Program assists college students in further developing their entrepreneurial aspirations.

Extension's Impact

- Fifty youth from 10 Nebraska counties participated in the first annual 4-H Entrepreneurship Challenge. Four winners received \$500 Engler Agribusiness Entrepreneurship program scholarships.
- Nine youth-owned businesses earned a total of \$2,100 in sales in four hours at the National Association of Extension 4-H Agents conference.
- In its second year, the Engler Agribusiness Entrepreneurship program has attracted 60 students, all of whom pursue the entrepreneurship minor.
- Eight students attended the inaugural Big Red Academic Camp in Entrepreneurship.
