While the sheep and goat inventory across Nebraska fluctuates from year to year, Nebraska Extension has become a resource for small ruminant producers to grow and develop their programs.

Sheep and goat producers local to Southeast Nebraska gathered at a goat operation to increase their knowledge on kidding, feeding, and overall management. Because Nebraska isn't the largest in sheep and goat producers, there are limited education resources for breeders. An attendee stated that they were excited for more opportunities offered to small ruminant producers. Shifting to livestock systems has allowed Nebraska Extension to serve a larger clientele.
